

2024-25 Scholarship Information for MS students in Regulatory Science

This fall, the University of St. Thomas' School of Engineering will offer up to five (5) \$3,000 scholarships to recognize outstanding graduate students and to help support their financial commitments involved in pursuing the Master of Science in Regulatory Science degree at the University of St. Thomas. We are able to offer these scholarships with the generous support of our medical device industry partners.

Each scholarship awardee will receive \$1,500 per semester in the fall and spring terms respectively for a total award of \$3,000. Awards are non-renewable, but applicants and awardees may re-apply for the scholarships in subsequent years.

Eligibility:

- Scholarship applicants must be admitted and enrolled in either the St. Thomas Master of Science in Regulatory Science program or the Graduate Certificate in Medical Device Development program in Fall 2024 and plan to continue in their program in Spring 2025.
- All eligibility requirements must be met prior to submitting a scholarship application.

Requirements:

- Scholarship applicants for the 2024-2025 academic year must complete and email all scholarship application documents to Mike Winegar, MS in Regulatory Science Program Director at wine7598@stthomas.edu by Monday August 26th, 2024.
- Scholarship applicants must currently be employed or intend to seek employment in the medical device or affiliated field.

Application Process: Students who have met the scholarship eligibility requirements listed above are invited to submit the items required in the application.

You must send all of the following required application items in one email to Mike Winegar at wine7598@stthomas.edu to complete your application:

- **Subject line** of email should state "St. Thomas Regulatory Science Dean's Scholarship"
- **Contact Info:** Include your full name, St. Thomas email address, St. Thomas ID number, and name of current employer (if applicable) in your email
- **Resume:** Attach an updated resume (.docx or .pdf file)
- **Written Statement:** Attach a written statement (up to 300 words) demonstrating how your participation in the St. Thomas Regulatory Science program (or Medical Device Development program) is helping you to achieve your goals. Include your motivations and any past accomplishments as they relate to employment in the medical device industry. (.docx or .pdf file)

Important Dates:

- **Monday August 26th, 2024:** Deadline to submit application email to Mike Winegar, including your contact information, resume and written statement.
- **Friday August 30th, 2024:** Scholarship recipients will be notified via email.
- **Tuesday September 3rd, 2024:** Deadline for acceptance of scholarship.
